#### FROM THE MANSE

#### Greetings all

As I pen this letter it is quite incredible to acknowledge that we are almost halfway through the year and what a year it is proving to be.



We, as the Church of Scotland, are actively seeking to discern the will of God for us at every level of our shared life. This will inevitably impact us at Bellshill Central, but I am confident that we will see God at work and that we will be strengthened in faith, hope and love.

One of the joys of being a parish minister is that I am given a glimpse into how God is at work in the wider sense of community and presbytery. On the 15th May, for instance, I was fulfilling one of my responsibilities as interim moderator at St Mark's in Wishaw. I had to chair the Annual Stated Meeting and this offered me an opportunity to gather with the congregation at St Mark's to join with them in thanking God for God's faithfulness these past few years. A church meeting can be seen as just another bit of business, but when placed in the context of worship, it reminds us that God is truly faithful and at work in the church and the wider community. My time at St Mark's reminded me that God is indeed at work throughout Lanarkshire.

While I was away at St Mark's, Alan was leading us in a festival of music at Bellshill Central. We are so blessed to have such a remarkable organist who is so willing to share his gifts, his time and his energy with us. The act

of worship on the 15th May, which followed his Hymnathon on the 14th, reminded me of the incredible gift of music as we sing our way into an awareness of God's presence.

If I had been at Bellshill Central on the 15th May, I would have continued in my series on God's revelation and God's reign. One of the most remarkable truths of the Christian faith is that God does choose to reveal Godself and that we are privileged to share in God's reign.

The two questions that I would have offered Bellshill Central on the 15th May as part of my sermon are valuable questions to ask of ourselves as we celebrate what God is doing in our midst and as we reflect on where God might be leading us. I thus offer them in my pastoral letter as an invitation to reflect on our shared life as we head into the summer months.

- a) How will I share in the reign of God this coming week/month/year? In other words how will I try to enter into a sense of what God is doing not only in my life as an individual, but also in terms of the wider sense of congregation, community, country and world?
- b) How might I think globally and act locally? In other words what one large issue, for example racism, sexism, pollution, war or poverty might I reflect on and respond to in such a way as to make a small difference in my local setting?

My honest prayer is that we will continue to trust God even during these times of challenge and uncertainty.

It was good to have your support at the Good Friday Service in St Andrew's Church, along with the Platinum Jubilee Celebration a few days later.


We are pleased to have the New Scottish Hymns Band in concert on Friday 7 October at 7pm - more information can be found here: www.newscottishhymns.com/

#### **CLLR ANGELA CAMPBELL**



**FROM NLC** - As we emerge from the pandemic, we face a new normal. We are aware that many people may have struggled with the loss of loved ones.

Good Grief is an informal discussion group, in a relaxed familiar setting to help ease and help process feelings of grief. We have invested in a collection of books around death, dying and grieving and these titles will be available alongside a safe place for people to attend, initially in Bellshill Cultural Centre, where people can come along and chat with others who are grieving over a cup of tea and a biscuit in a safe, warm and friendly environment.

# The Corbett Memorial Sunday 29 May 2022

Our worship was enhanced by beautiful flowers in memory of Sergeant James Corbett. The Sunday closest to his death is remembered each year.

The four central windows were gifted by Matthew Corbett, in memory of his son Sergeant James Brownlie Corbett of the Royal Air Force, who was shot down and killed over Holland on 26 May 1943. These windows were designed and fitted by the Abbey Studio - likely under the direction of James Crombie. They were dedicated on 7 October 1962.

The Good Friday Window contains an RAF roundel marking the significance of the services for James.
