

This service will be led by Father Stuart Parkes, and will involve our own Ian Douglas and local celebrant Alma Rae.


## **CHRISTMAS MEMORY TREE**

## **PRESBYTERY MISSION PLAN UPDATE**

Since the last magazine, the Implementation Team from The Presbytery of Forth Valley and Clydesdale (FVAC) have met with a joint working group from all three congregations on two occasions.

“The question of the final decision regarding building use in Bellshill is difficult to determine. The Planning & Implementation Committee is anxious to find a way forward that gives the Church presence in Bellshill the best option to fulfil mission in the area.”

Following the first meeting a joint statement was read out in church, explaining that due to issues with the Bellshill West site, options for the place of worship in Bellshill would be either the Bellshill Central site or the former Orbiston Church site.

We had to send in all of our timetabled activities, so that a timetabling exercise could be undertaken to see if all current activities from Bellshill Central & Bellshill West could be accommodated in either of the options.

At a second meeting, the implementation team decided to change their stance that the Bellshill West site was no longer a viable option for Bellshill. We were then presented with a list of six options, which included both Bellshill Central and West sites, and also Orbiston. The list includes “hybrid” options covering more than one site.

Following this meeting, a Kirk Session was called, and a frank and honest discussion took place. Six members of session were appointed to a series of working groups, to take forward:

- Timetabling – Lorna Watson and Emily Aitken
- Building Costs – Drew Aitken and Alan Mathew
- Site Valuations – Stanley Cook and Zandra Swan

## **What is next?**

We are currently awaiting contact from the Implementation Team Convenor, David Alexander, on how these three groups with members of each congregation will take shape and the timescales we are working towards.

We do not anticipate that these groups will have their findings until at least the Spring of 2025 at the earliest.

## **How can you be part of this?**

It is vital that for you to help shape the future of the Church in Bellshill that you keep attending Sunday Services and supporting Bellshill Central Parish Church in every way that you can.

You need to let your Kirk Session team know of how you would like the Church in Bellshill to serve our community. The activities, mission and outreach that we want to deliver needs the best location and buildings, and for us to consider and help choose the right place we need to know how you want the space to be used. So please speak to any member of the Kirk Session teams.

## **What will happen in the short term?**

We won't see any significant changes in how we are "church" at Bellshill Central.

However, we will try and do more things together as the cluster of three churches; for example activities across the cluster during Christmas are shared in the magazine, and daily short videos shared on Social Media. As we move into 2025 we will arrange pulpit exchanges, to allow the Rev Iain Majcher to get to know better both congregations in Bellshill.

Her recollections of rationing and everyday life in the country were most interesting and amusing. In conjunction with Anna, Joyce has produced a book which was on sale, the proceeds being donated to Chest, Heart & Stroke charity.

Joyce proved to be one of the best speakers we have heard and was most appreciated by our members. Should anyone wish to read her book, several Guild members purchased it and I'm sure would be happy to lend it to you.

The following week we enjoyed a Halloween Party, complete with dooking for apples and goody bags distributed. Several ladies also dressed up for the occasion too.

Our next meeting consisted of a power point presentation on Unida - one of six projects supported by the Guild nationally. Details of this

project will be relayed to the congregation on 1st December when the Guild will be leading worship.

Guild numbers have dropped this session, due to ill health and the death of two long-serving members. If you are curious about the Guild, why not come along and enjoy an afternoon of fellowship? Men will also be made most welcome. We continue to meet weekly on Monday afternoons.

Leading up to Christmas the new girls will be making their promise and we have lots of activities planned towards a new badge they are working on.


We are also delighted to welcome back Holly, our unit helper, who has been off on maternity leave so we are all looking forward to seeing her again.

## FINANCE UPDATE



WFO for the 9 months ended 30 September 2024 amounts to £20,611 which is £1,889 short of our target for the period.

Open Plate, however, at £2,085 has exceeded our target of £1,500 for the nine month period.

Although we are currently £1,889 below our forecast, the final quarter of the period included the holiday period and joint services during which donations decrease.

## WHAT IS GIFT AID?

Gift Aid is a government scheme which allows a congregation, as a registered charity, to claim 25p from HMRC every time an individual donates £1. The donor must have made a Gift Aid declaration giving the congregation permission to claim on their offerings and donations.

The donor must be a UK tax payer and have paid as much or more income tax and/or capital gains tax in the tax year than will be reclaimed through Gift Aid on their donations.

The logo consists of the words "giftaid it" in a large, black, cursive font. The "i" in "it" is smaller and positioned below the "t".

### Common Myths

You need to tell us your income – **NO**

You need to tell us what you donate – **YES**, but we will know that through your FWO envelopes or bank transfer. Only Zandra, June and Donis know these details.

### What does Gift Aid do to your offerings?

If your weekly offering was £5, that would turn it into £6.25 at no additional cost to you.

Last year we were able to reclaim £5012.80 in Gift Aid from the UK Government. If you were able to join the scheme or increase what you are able to donate to the work of our church, we would be able to increase our reclaim amount in 2024.

If you want to fill in a Gift Aid declaration form, please speak to Zandra Swan or Donis Hudson. If you want to check you are still part of the scheme, again speak to Zandra or Donis.
