PRESBYTERY MISSION PLANNING UPDATE

Since the last Church Magazine, there have been meetings between the Kirk Session, Congregational Board and the Presbytery Implementation Committee. We have also approached Viewpark Church to explore how we might be able to work together, either in Team Ministry or Union. We have reaffirmed our commitment to serve the people of Bellshill from 346 Main Street. The current allocation of ministries in the Presbytery allow Bellshill Central a 50% minister.

Kirk Session and Congregational Board members met with a representative from the Implementation Committee on 4th August. It was a meeting with positive steps forward for our congregation, that will bear fruit for our mission in Bellshill. We will be getting help from the Mission Officer for the Presbytery to help us pull together our new Mission Plan that will form our Parish Profile when the time comes to seek our new minister. We hope to be able to call a 50% minister to our town and church on a 7-year reviewable tenure, which was the same way that Kevin was called in 2015.

We will keep you all updated of developments and ask for your continued prayers.

In the last Chronicle, I was encouraging you to buy Life and Work. However, at the General Assembly in May, it was decided that Life and Work would come to an end and it has now sadly ceased publication.

The first edition of Life and Work was published in January 1879; the brain child of its first Editor, Rev Professor Archibald Charteris. This was the same Professor Charteris who established the Church Guild which remains very active in the Church.

Life and Work kept everyone up to date with what has happening in the Church and was always full of bit and pieces of news from various congregations. Bellshill Central appeared several times in recent years. The magazine had contributed significant surpluses to the Church of Scotland prior to 2020 but, like other printed newspapers, reader numbers have been falling.

We will be taking donations for this event from Sunday 2nd November.


Santa will pay us a visit again where there will be a gift for everyone.


MOSSEND PRIMARY SCHOOL SUMMER SERVICE

We were delighted to host the End of Term service for 2024/25 and it was brilliant to see our church so full to overflowing, and so happy.







WHAT IS GIFT AID?

Gift Aid is a government scheme which allows a congregation, as a



registered charity, to claim 25p from HMRC every time an individual donates £1. The donor must have made a Gift Aid declaration giving the congregation permission to claim on their offerings and donations. The donor must be a UK tax payer and have paid as much or more income tax and/or capital gains tax in the tax year than will be reclaimed through Gift Aid on their donations.

Common Myths

You need to tell us your income – **NO**You need to tell us what you donate – **YES**, but we will know that through your FWO envelopes or bank transfer. Only Zandra, June and Donis know these details.

What does Gift Aid do to your offerings?

If your weekly offering was £5, that would turn it into £6.25 at no additional cost to you.

Last year we were able to reclaim £4,646.00 in Gift Aid from the UK Government. If you were able to join the scheme or increase what you are able to donate to the work of our church, we would be able to increase our reclaim amount in 2025.

If you want to fill in a Gift Aid declaration form, please speak to Zandra Swan or Donis Hudson. If you want to check you are still part of the scheme, again speak to Zandra or Donis.


